<u>Celebrant</u>: The Lord be with you! All: **And with your Spirit.** 

<u>Celebrant</u>: A reading from the Gospel, † according to Mark: All: Glory to you, O Lord.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." He replied, "What do you wish me to do for you?" They answered him, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" They said to him, "We can." Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right or at my left is not mine to give but is for those for whom it has been prepared. "When the ten heard this, they became indignant at James and John. Jesus summoned them and said to them, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt. But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

#### Homily

#### 11. PROFESSION OF FAITH (APOSTLE'S CREED)

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and Earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

#### 12. PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL

<u>Celebrant</u>: Brothers and sisters, trusting in the Lord, who is our help and protection, let us pray:

Response: Grant us, O Lord, your grace!

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- 1. Lord, you call us to proclaim your Word through our witness; accompany your Church as it seeks to live synodality in communion, participation and mission. **Response**
- 2. Lord, in this Eucharist we will receive your Body and Blood, the sacrament of the mystery of Easter; grant that we may leave here today renewed in our commitment to follow you and never to separate ourselves from you. **Response**
- 3. Lord, you have reminded us that in your Church, whoever wishes to be great must be a servant; keep us always in the service of one another and help our missionaries in the fulfillment of your will. **Response**
- 4. Lord, you have asked us to remain firm in the faith we profess; Grant that in moments of anguish, suffering and persecution, we may keep our hope in You alone. Response: **Grant us, O Lord, your grace!**

(Other prayers of the community)

<u>Celebrant</u>: Let us close our requests by saying together the prayer for the missionary month:

Lord God, Father of all human beings, / grant that we Christians, / anointed with the power of the Holy Spirit, / may cooperate in your mission to the ends of the earth, / bearing witness to Jesus / and proclaiming the Gospel of the Kingdom with urgency, respect and kindness. / Open our ears to receive your command: "Go!" / Open our mouths to invite everyone to the banquet of your Son! / Open our eyes to recognize all the situations / of indifference, injustice and rejection present in the world! / Help us to be a synodal Church on mission, / pilgrims of hope, / building bridges of fraternity and solidarity among peoples. / Mary, Star of Evangelization, pray for us. / Amen!

<u>Celebrant</u>: Lift up your hearts. All: We lift them up to the Lord.

**Celebrant:** Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.

All: It is right and just.

# Preface VII:

It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God. For you so loved the world that in your mercy you sent us the Redeemer, to live like us in all things nut sin, so that you might love in us what you loved in your Son, by whose obedience we have been restored to those gifts of yours that, by sinning, we had lost in disobedience. Therefore, O Lord, we humbly implore you: by the same Spirit graciously make holy these gifts we have brought to you for consecration, that they may become the Body and † Blood of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ at whose command we celebrate these mysteries.

(Institution Narrative) (recalling the words of Jesus at the Last supper)

For on the night, he was betrayed he himself took bread, and, giving you thanks, he said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying:

# TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND EAT OF IT, FOR THIS IS MY BODY, WHICH WILL BE GIVEN UP FOR YOU.

In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took the chalice, and, giving you thanks, he said the blessing, and gave the chalice to his disciples, saying:

TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND DRINK FROM IT, FOR THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD, THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL COVENANT, WHICH WILL BE POURED OUT FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS. DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME. The mystery of faith.

All: When we eat this Bread, and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.

#### (Anamnesis, Offering, and Intercessions) (Stand up)

Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the saving Passion of your Son, his wondrous Resurrection and Ascension into heaven, and as we look forward to his second coming, we offer you in thanksgiving this holy and living sacrifice.

Look, we pray, upon the oblation of your Church and, recognizing the sacrificial Victim by whose death you willed to reconcile us to yourself, grant that we, who are nourished by the Body and Blood of your Son and filled with his Holy Spirit, may become one body, one spirit in Christ.

May he make of us an eternal offering to you, so that we may obtain an inheritance with your elect, especially with the most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, Her spouse St. Joseph, with your blessed Apostles and glorious Martyrs (St. Jude) and with all the Saints, on whose constant intercession in your presence we rely for unfailing help.

May this Sacrifice of our reconciliation, we pray, O Lord, advance the peace and salvation of all the world. Be pleased to confirm in faith and charity your pilgrim Church on earth, with your servant **FRANCIS** our Pope and **Odilo** our Bishop and his councillors, the Order of Bishops, all the clergy, and the entire people you have gained for your own. Listen graciously to the prayers of this family, whom you have summoned before you: in your compassion, O merciful Father, gather to yourself all your children scattered throughout the world.

† To our departed brothers and sisters and to all who were pleasing to you at their passing from this life, give kind admittance to your kingdom. There we hope to enjoy forever the fullness of your glory through Christ our Lord, through whom you bestow on the world all that is good.†

<u>Celebrant</u>: Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever. All: **Amen.** 

## 16. COMMUNION RITE

<u>Celebrant</u>: At the Savior's command, formed by divine teaching, we dare to say together:

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on Earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

<u>Celebrant</u>: Deliver us, Lord; we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all

distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

All: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever.

<u>Celebrant</u>: Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you; look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will, Who live and reign for ever and ever. All: **Amen.** 

<u>Celebrant</u>: The peace of the Lord be with you always. All: **And also with you.** 

<u>Celebrant</u>: Let us offer each other (orally) the sign of peace. All: **Peace be with you.** 

#### 17. LAMB OF GOD

(2x) Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the World, Have mercy on us.

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the World: Grant us peace.

<u>Celebrant</u>: This is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world. Happy are those who are called to his supper.

All: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.
